SYNOPSIS FOR THE PAST 24 HOURS.

The barometer has risen in the Southern, Middle and New England States, with generally clear and warmer weather.

Partly cloudy weather has prevailed in the Lake region, with fresh or brisk winds, a slight rise of temperature and falling barometer.

Generally clear and decidedly warm weather prevailed in the Mississippi and Missouri valleys during the day.

Light or gentle variable winds are reported from the districts on the Atlantic coast. The Ohio river has risen at Pittsburgh and Cincinnati.

PROBABILITIES.

For New England and the Middle States, generally clear and warmer weather will prevail, with west or south winds and no decided change in the barometer.

For the South Atlantic and Gulf States, Tennessee and the Ohio valley, clear or fair weather, east or south winds, rising temperature, except on the south Atlantic coast, and slight changes in the barometer.

For the Lake region, partly cloudy and warmer weather, with south or west winds, low barometer and rain north of Lakes Erie and Ontario.

For the Northwest, partly cloudy and decidedly warm weather, with southeast or southwest winds and continued low barometer.
