**MILITARY HISTORY.**—Private Commonwealth Artillery, of Philadelphia, April, 1861. Second Lieutenant 31st Pennsylvania Volunteer Infantry, August, 1861. First Lieutenant 31st Pennsylvania Volunteer Infantry, September, 1861. With Signal Corps, attached to 1st Corps, Army of the Potomac. In General McDowell's campaign from capture of Fredericksburg, Virginia, to the pursuit of Stonewall Jackson up the Shenandoah Valley. Assistant Signal Officer, Beaufort, S. C. Chief Signal Officer, Department of Virginia and North Carolina. At the siege of Suffolk, and with expedition to White House, Va. Captain 82d Pennsylvania Volunteer Infantry. Captain U. S. Signal Corps, June, 1863. Member of Board for the examination of candidates for appointment in Signal Corps at New Orleans, La. In operations of Army of the Potomac at Mine Run, Va.; Custer's raid to Charlottesville and Stannardsville, and Grant's campaign of 1864 and 1865. Engaged at the battles of the Wilderness, Spottsylvania, Cold Harbor, North Anna, Hatcher's Run, Numbers 1, 3, and 4, Peeble's Farm, Weldon Railroad, siege and fall of Petersburg, and pursuit and capture of the Rebel Army under General Lee. With Head-Quarters 5th Army Corps. Chief Signal Officer, Army of the Potomac, December, 1864, to its disbandment, June, 1865. Brevet Major U. S. Volunteers, for gallant and meritorious services in the operations resulting in the fall of Richmond and the surrender of the Insurgent Army under General R. E. Lee. Second Lieutenant 10th U. S. Infantry, February, 1866. First Lieutenant 10th U. S. Infantry, February, 1866. Brevet Captain U. S. Army, for gallant and meritorious services in the campaign from the Rapidan to the James. Brevet Major U. S. Army, for gallant and meritorious services in the siege of Petersburg, Virginia. Assistant Adjutant-General and Ordnance Officer, District of Minnesota, June, 1866, to April, 1869. Post Adjutant, Corpus Christi, Texas, from July, 1869, to —.
